Common Causes of Building Collapses

Almost any type of building is at risk of collapse, depending on the underlying cause. While buildings under construction are at particular risk of collapse, recently completed buildings and older structures are also at risk. Building collapses can happen for a variety of reasons. Some of the more common causes include the following.

- Defective or inadequate building materials
- Design, engineering, or construction flaws
- Improperly laid foundations
- Poor maintenance
- Failure to repair structural issues
- Environmental causes such as fire, wind, or flood
- Failure to comply with building, occupancy, or fire codes

Whatever the cause of the collapse, you may be entitled to compensation if you were injured. A North Carolina building collapse attorney can evaluate your claim and help you get the compensation you deserve.

Are You Entitled to Workers' Compensation?

If you were injured in a building collapse while at work, you may be able to file a claim for workers' compensation benefits. This applies to almost anyone, provided that they were an employee who wasperforming their job duties when the collapse occurred. If successful, your workers' compensation benefits could cover the following:

- 100 percent of your medical expenses arising from the collapse
- Up to two-thirds of your average weekly income so long as you are unable to work

Workers' compensation will also pay death benefits to the worker's surviving spouse and children. If your claim is approved, workers' compensation will cover the following:

- Any medical expenses incurred as a result of the collapse prior to death
- Funeral and burial expenses
- Up to two-thirds of the worker's weekly average income for up to 500 weeks
