The Standard of Care

Like other **personal injury** cases, medical malpractice cases require that you prove negligence. However, medical malpractice cases are unique in that negligence is determined by whether the doctor or other healthcare professional failed to meet the standard of care applicable to your case.

Generally speaking, the standard of care applicable in a medical malpractice case is defined as the level of care that an ordinarily prudent healthcare professional with the same amount of training and experience would provide in the same case. In other words, you likely cannot hold your family doctor liable for medical malpractice if they failed to diagnose a disease that only a specialist would be able to identify. Similarly, a young, inexperienced surgeon may not be held to the same standard in a procedure that is ordinarily performed by a surgeon with years of experience.

Determining the appropriate standard of care can be difficult. An experienced Raleigh medical malpractice lawyer will be able to review your case and determine whether you have a claim.

Medical Malpractice Cases Are Complex

Another reason why medical malpractice cases are so difficult for non-lawyers to pursue is that they are far more complex than other personal injury cases such as **car accidents**. In addition to determining the standard of care discussed above, medical malpractice cases involve complex medical terminology and complicated facts.
